Why breastfeed?



Exclusive breastfeeding for at least six months has numerous health benefits to both the mother and baby and is recommended by the World Health Organization (WHO).

Breastfeeding is not always easy and it takes patience and time to learn. Support is important, especially during baby's first few weeks.
